- What kind of books did you really like? Why?
- Tell me about where you got most of the books that you read as a teenager/young adult. [prompt: local library, college library, works library, bookshops new or secondhand?]
- Did anyone encourage you to read?
- Did anyone make you feel that reading was a waste of time?
- Where and when did you find time to read?
- Were you ever made to feel embarrassed about what you read a guilty pleasure? Or did you ever read anything because you thought it would improve you in any way? [if appropriate: lowbrow, middlebrow, highbrow]
- Which books did you read with pleasure when you were young that you wouldn't dream of reading again? Why not?
- Do any of the following authors or books ring any bells with you? [Prompt: choose names from the list that seem to link with the kinds of books the reader has liked; encourage interviewee to reflect on what h/she liked about them]
- Are there any ways in which your reading has changed your life?
